

## The 2+2 Program

The Department of Agricultural Economics welcomes transfer students from Community Colleges who wish to continue their education and pursue their Bachelor's degree at Kansas State University.

To seamlessly transition from your Community College to K-State, we recommend that you enroll at K-State as a junior, which means you should plan to transfer in approximately 60 credit hours that apply toward your Bachelor's degree.

**Maximum number of credit hours that can be applied to your K-State degree from a two-year institution:**

# 63hrs.

When working with your Community College adviser to select coursework, choose courses that interest you, but also plan to select courses that you will be able to apply toward your degree at K-State. If you attend your Community College for two full years, we also strongly recommend completing the following courses/areas prior to transferring to K-State:

- General Calculus & Linear Algebra
- Agricultural Economics & Macroeconomics
- Accounting Requirements

Whether you choose the Agricultural Economics or Agribusiness program, at least 12 credits will be free electives.

## Required Courses

The following is a list of required K-State lower division courses for which your Community College may have equivalencies.

### Communications: 12 Hours

- ENGL 100 Expository Writing I
- ENGL 200 Expository Writing II
- COMM 105 Public Speaking IA  
**or**
- COMM 106 Public Speaking I
- Choose **one Elective Course** in:
  - English (above 210),
  - Communication, **or**
  - Modern Language

### Quantitative: 6-9 Hours

- MATH 100 College Algebra
- MATH 205 General Calculus & Linear Algebra
- STAT 350 Business Economics

### Natural Science: 8 hours

Choose two from the following:

- CHM 110/111 General Chemistry and Lab
- BIOL 198 Principles of Biology
- PHYS 113 General Physics I and Lab

### Social Sciences: 6 hours

- PSYCH 110 General Psychology  
**or**
- SOCIO 211 Introduction to Sociology
- **Select an Elective Course** from one of the following areas:
  - Psychology, Sociology, Geography, History, Anthropology, Political Science, Women's Studies, **or** American Ethnic Studies

### Humanities: 3 Hours

- **Select an Elective Course** from one of the following areas:
  - History, Art, Philosophy, English, Theatre, Dance, Modern Language, or Music

### Agricultural Economics: 6 Hours

- ECON 110 Principles of Macroeconomics
- AGECE 120 AgEcon and Agribusiness

### Accounting: 6-9 hours\*

- ACCTG 231 Accounting for Business Operations
- ACCTG 241 Accounting for Investing & Financing

*\*K-State accounting concepts may be covered in a different sequence at other schools. Because of that, we recommend that you either complete all credits to transfer or wait to take your accounting courses at K-State. Consult the transfer equivalency site ([www.k-state.edu/admit/tran\\_info.html](http://www.k-state.edu/admit/tran_info.html)) for specific Accounting 231 and 241 requirements.*

### Agricultural Technology: 6 Hours

Select a combination of courses to meet the 6 credit hour requirement:

- HORT 201 Intro. to Horticulture Science
- ASI 102 Principles of Animal Science
- ASI 105 Animal Science & Industry
- ASI 106 Dairy/Poultry Science
- ASI 300 Principles of Livestock Feeding
- AGRON 220 Crop Science
- AGRON 305 Soils
- AGRON 330 Weed Management

## Transfer Credit Check

K-State is proud to serve our transfer student population to make the transition to our four-year institution as seamless as possible. However, it is important to understand that not all courses available at your Community College may be applied as transfer credit toward program requirements for your Bachelor's degree at K-State.

To determine which of your Community College courses can apply toward meeting graduation requirements at K-State, first determine the K-State equivalent course, then check the curriculum requirements of your K-State major to determine how the course will apply.
